

Outside Edge

An afternoon's cricket turns into utter chaos

Set in a cricket pavilion, Outside Edge deals with an eventful Saturday afternoon in the lives of five men and four women. Roger struggles to keep his team together to play against the British Railways Maintenance Division Guildford East, while the wives and girlfriends of his players help and hinder to devastating and hilarious effects. The action takes place at the cricket pavilion before and during a match, with the pitch being offstage where the audience is sitting.

While the play is ostensibly about cricket, it's actually about relationships - and Harris is soon lifting the lid on all manner of angst and extra-marital shenanigans among the lead characters.

Cricket made simple

For those in the audience who do not know the great game, we have provided the following explanation in the hope that your enjoyment of the play will be enhanced:

You have two sides, one out in the field and one in. Each man that's in the side that's in goes out, and when he's out he comes in and the next man goes in until he's out. When they are all out, the side that's out comes in and the side that's been in goes out and tries to get those coming in, out. Sometimes you get men still in and not out.

When a man goes out to go in, the men who are out try to get him out, and when he is out he goes in and the next man in goes out and goes in. There are two men called umpires who stay out all the time and they decide when the men who are in are out. When both sides have been in and all the men have been out, and both sides have been out twice after all the men have been in, including those who are not out, that is the end of the game!
